

SPARK Active Kids Program Volunteer

Location	Selected primary schools in Western Sydney
Why we need you?	SPARK is a settlement support program that provides social, cultural and educational support to newly arrived children and families of refugee and migrant background. Many of the children we work with, have had their learning and development disrupted for a variety of reasons. This disruption may affect children's socialisation or physical development, as well as their academic progress. SPARK's Active Kids Program uses active play to teach children how to make friends, and it improves motor and coordination skills.
Who we need?	<p>Enthusiastic, energetic and positive volunteers who bring a sense of fun to activities. Volunteers are also patient, approachable and sensitive to cross-cultural issues and challenges. They are also team orientated, committed and reliable. A reasonable knowledge of English is required.</p> <p><i>Highly desirable volunteers might have experience in sports coaching, knowledge of health science or nutrition, experience working with children or youths or experience facilitating groups.</i></p>
What you will be doing?	Plan, prepare and run the Active Kids program with a small team of volunteers. An Active Kids session might include sports activities (e.g. soccer skills, softball skills), group games and active play (e.g. relays, obstacles, parachutes, tunnel ball), and healthy eating and living messages. This is a hands-on volunteer roll with lots of room for creativity.
What will you get out of it?	This is a fun and creative way to experience the diversity and richness of other cultures while enjoying the rewards of helping others. SPARK volunteers are well supported with professional help and ongoing training available. Leadership opportunities are available.
How long is the commitment?	Typically 2 hours per week, 6 weeks per school term. Volunteers commit to a minimum of 2 terms per year – <i>but we'd love you to sign up for more.</i>

IMPACT

SPARK's key aim is that families and children from a refugee, asylum seeker and migrant background settle well. They are able to fully participate in the community's social, educational and economic life, and so are less vulnerable to exclusion and discrimination, social and health issues, and disadvantage.

Children: Newly arrived children from a refugee and migrant background settle well into school and their community. They have learning and social skills, and make good academic progress. They have resilience and good emotional and mental health.

Families: Newly arrived families settle well into the school and local community. Parents engage with and support children's learning; have the confidence and knowledge to connect with the school and the awareness, skills and connections to access support and progress their settlement.

Schools: Schools have the capacity to support the successful settlement of newly arrived children and families into school and the school community. Schools partner on initiatives that support the children's learning and adjustment, and engage parents in children's learning and in school community activities.

SPARK delivers programs across 10 schools in Western Sydney and works with several community partners within Fairfield, Liverpool, Auburn and Parramatta.

SPARK reaches 300 children on weekly basis and another 200 children through workshop based programs. It engages and supports 150 parents and toddlers through workshops, excursions and support programs.
